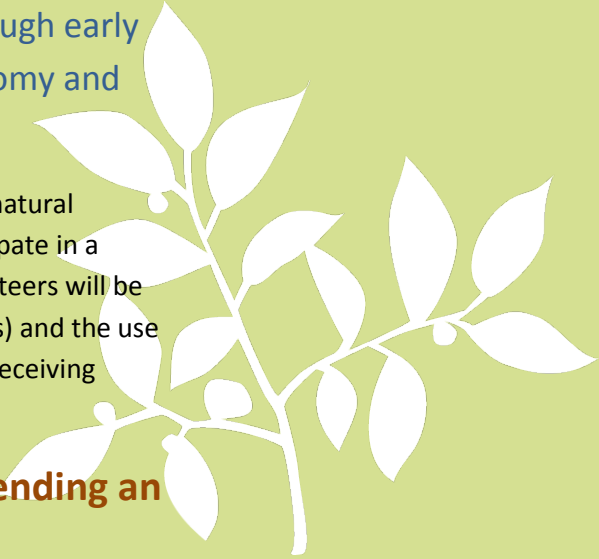


Invasive Plant Early Detection and Rapid Response (EDRR) Workshops in Montana
