

**Erik Lehnhoff** is the Assistant Director for Research at the Center for Invasive Plant Management, Montana State University (MSU) in Bozeman, Montana. His recent work has focused on early detection and rapid response (EDRR) systems for weed management and on the ecology of saltcedar (*Tamarisk*) invaded sites in Montana. Erik received his Ph.D. from MSU where he focused on large-area weed surveys and population monitoring as means of prioritizing management. Prior to attending MSU, Erik earned a B.S. in civil engineering from Clemson University and a M.S. in environmental engineering from Tennessee Technological University, and worked as a professional engineer and environmental consultant for eight years in Nashville, TN.
