

## Dalmatian Toadflax *Linaria dalmatica*

### Why should I get to know this weed?

Weeds, such as Dalmatian toadflax, can degrade the ecological and economic values of the lands we care about by altering native plant communities. When weeds are detected early, they can be more easily removed or contained. Preventing weeds from spreading into new areas is beneficial to all of us!

### How can I identify it?

Dalmatian toadflax, a stout-looking plant that grows up to 3 feet in height, is found in rangelands, pastures and along roads in arid environments.



yellow snapdragon-like flowers  
(may have a faint orange center)

stout stem

rubbery, heart-shaped leaves  
clasp the stem
